

Hatched in Virginia 2013 Supply List for Flowers in Lace

Your workshop fee includes the entire Flowers in Lace collection (42 designs), directions for Flowers in Lace quilt, and the Flowers in Lace Quilt Block Color Charts. Before you begin stitching, Santi will show you a variety of projects completed with this sophisticated and delicate collection and she will demonstrate how she designs the quilt blocks from the individual elements. If you want to learn multihooping and experience how individual design becomes sensational creations this is a great class to have fun stitching meticulously digitized embroidery created by Santi.

The most difficult task of this workshop is deciding where to stitch these gorgeous designs! If you are planning to stitch on pants/jeans – **have the garment (or fabric) prepared BEFORE the event by prewashing the garment and opening the leg seam of pants/jeans.** If you plan to make a garment, be sure to lightly sketch the outline of the jacket, etc. on your background fabric and allow at least an additional 2-3 inches around the perimeter of the background fabric. If you plan to make a quilt block(s) in class (in preparation to make the entire quilt), a pillow, bed warmer, table runner or topper – bring your background fabric/garment/pre-made linen. Susan Mars from www.allaboutblanks.com has beautiful linen tableware for these designs.

Santi and Venitta will assist you with any project you wish to make with this collection. If you are unsure, make a quilt block or two which can become a table topper, pillow or wall hanging.

For one quilt block:

18" square of background fabric (I have two samples of block 6 stitched, one on white Kona cotton and one on black Kona cotton). Santi's original background fabric was medium purple linen.

Machine supplies

- Embroidery/sewing machine (clean, oiled, new needle, working well) with at least 5 x 7 embroidery capability, power cord, embroidery foot, embroidery module, extension cord, embroidery bobbin, tweezers, brush to clean your machine, oil
- Flowers in Lace designs loaded into your machine memory (or on a floppy disc, memory card, or USB stick – unzipped and ready to be stitched),
- Embroidery throat plate, embroidery hoops (at least 5 x7, Mega, Jumbo) **AND** template grids (for accurate placement) for all hoops
- Machine needles for embroidery (I use Organ #80 sharp)
- Embroidery foot, machine manual
- **Basic supplies:** washout marking pencil, fabric and paper scissors, ultra fine black Sharpie marker, ruler (6 x 24), rotary cutter with new blade, straight pins, thread snips, cellophane tape. There will be rotary mats available and ironing stations.
- If you have a **BERNINA 830/7-Series or Ellisimo or Diamond or any of the large embroidery/sewing machines** you **will need additional stabilization on your sewing table at the church** – go to a Lowe's/Home Depot type store and purchase a 3/4" depth x 19" wide x 47" (length to fit your machine/embroidery module with at least an extra 4") long particle board shelf (and bring it with you. There is a Home Depot 5 minutes from the church if you want to wait until you arrive in Fredericksburg to purchase.

Embroidery supplies

- You will receive all the designs in Flowers in Lace collection from Hatched in Africa. Designs will be mailed by June 24 in the format listed on your registration form
- Stabilizer: medium weight tear away or if you prefer sticky tear away stabilizer, washout stabilizer if working on table ware project, polymesh cutaway if working on a garment
- Washout stabilizer (Aqua mesh, Aqua magic, etc) for free standing flowers
- Master Hooper optional (if you have it bring it) and/or Santi's Thumb Tack Board
- Vellum templates of the designs you plan to use -- if you need help on how to do this, just send Venitta an email (hcmquilter@verizon.net)
- Bobbins with light weight bobbin thread

Threads

Santi's sample was stitched with a combination of Robison-Anton and Yenmet threads – if you want to use the same threads, refer to the handout Flowers in Lace Quilt Block Color Charts.

Santi's original colors are Marathon Rayon and are found in the color charts with the designs.

You may choose these as a starting point and change to your taste or decide on your own color scheme. If you decide to do your own color (background fabric and thread choices,) I suggest that you open one of the designs in your software and change the colors to your design scheme. Write down the colors you have substituted for each of the block designs in the color chart handout.


