Row I:
Velveting, Embroidered
Couching, Organza cutwork
flowers, Cutwork

Row II:
In the Hoop quilting, Appliqué flowers
in the center
Embroidered Chenille, Free-standing
Lace flower

Row III:
Textured appliqué, Mylar appliqué,
silk flower appliqué
Twin needle embroidery, Flower
Fringing

Fabric

- Nine pieces of background fabric (approximately 11 x 14 – size to fit your 5x7 hoop). Suggestions are linen, Kona cotton or other top quality cotton, a light colored fabric may be best to highlight the various techniques. Bring a few extra for insurance☺
- Chenille sample - (3) 10" squares of flannel – plaids and or stripes look great
- In the Hoop sample – (4) 5" squares of cotton and (2) different 4" squares for center appliqué flowers in the middle of the In the Hoop sample
- Texturing sample – (1) 10" square of cotton for appliqué flower
- Organza cutwork – (2) 11" squares of Organza (choose color to match your color scheme)
- Fabric requirements for finishing the quilt and will be sent with the designs

Special Notions/Supplies

- Wing Needle Size 110 or 120 (be sure to bring the embroidery foot and machine throat plate that will allow for stitching with a wing needle)
- Couching foot or attachment (BERNINA #43), please check if your machine make/model has the ability to couch with the embroidery module. If not, I will have a machine available for you to complete this step. If your machine does have this capability, please bring about 3-4 yards of whatever threads work with your couching with embroidery function.
- Silk flowers – bring 4 -5 flowers in various sizes that work with your color scheme

- Texture Magic, Mylar, silk flowers and couching thread/yarn will be supplied (feel free to bring your own if you prefer OR if you want YOUR colors)
- Button variety – not needed for the workshop but this is a great project to use some of your novelty (birds, bees, butterflies) buttons as well as odd buttons here and there☺
- Sharp, fine point scissors for cutting chenille sample, appliqué fabrics and flowers
- Glue stick or glue pen, sharp seam ripper

Embroidery supplies

- You will receive directions and all the designs used in the Sampler will be emailed to you by June 24 in the format listed on your registration form
- Stabilizer: Water-soluble stabilizer (Aqua mesh, Aqua magic), Medium weight tear away
- Master Hooper optional (if you have it bring it) and/or Santi's Thumb Tack Board
- Bobbins with light weight bobbin thread

Thread

- Construction thread to make the sampler (you will receive written directions but will not have time in class to construct the quilt.
- Workshop will include stitching eight different techniques on 9" x 7" (finished size) rectangles. Threads – Look at Sue's Sampler – her color scheme was pink, purple, green
 - Plan on 3-4 greens, 3-4 main colors, 3-4 accent colors, and 1-2 gold tones - plan to match the fabrics you have in your color scheme.

Machine supplies

- Embroidery/sewing machine (clean, oiled, new needle, working well) with at least 5 x 7 embroidery capability, power cord, embroidery foot, embroidery module, extension cord, embroidery bobbin, foot pedal, tweezers, brush to clean your machine, oil)
- Sampler designs loaded into your machine memory (or on a floppy disc, memory card, or USB stick – unzipped and ready to be stitched),
- Embroidery throat plate, embroidery hoop (at least 5 x7 or larger). Machine needles for embroidery (I use Organ #80 sharp)
- **Basic supplies:** washout marking pencil, fabric and paper scissors, straight pins, thread snips.
- If you have a **BERNINA 830/780 or Ellisimo or any of the large embroidery/sewing machines** you **will need additional stabilization on your sewing table at the church** – go to a Lowe's/Home Depot type store and purchase a 3/4" depth x 19" wide x 47" (length to fit your machine/embroidery module with at least an extra 4") long particle board shelf (and bring it with you. There is a Home Depot 5 minutes from the church if you want to wait until you arrive in Fredericksburg to purchase.
